| Subject | Details of Revision Task |

TASK - Read page 19 (Christianity 1.6 The Crucifixion). In your own words, write down why Jesus' Crucifixion is important to Christians, aim for 3 bullet points. TASK - read through page 51 (Sikhism - 3.5 the five stages of liberation). Summarise all of the five khands (stages of liberation). Then, summarise all of the five evils, you may choose to bullet point these. |
