# WELCOME


## CURRICULUM

At Key Stage 3, students study the well-established Literacy for Life programme which has been developed over the past 14 years and is increasingly used in schools across the region. This fully covers the national curriculum.

Children can struggle to make the transition to Secondary School; in many schools, they find themselves in an unfamiliar environment with a large number of teachers who may rarely see them and for whom they are not their top priority.


Our Literacy for Life model allows for a smooth transition from primary school, allows us to produce great outcomes and you can be sure your child has a teacher dedicated to their progress as their top priority.

The curriculum is exciting and based around a series of innovative themes which gives students rich experiences. We also provide a laptop for each student, ensuring they have access to cutting-edge software to support them.









# SUPPORTING STUDENTS

We want to support students to be successful. This starts with making sure the Academy environment is supportive and students are well-behaved. Ofsted stated:

"Pupils' behaviour is exceptional. Pupils display excellent self-control and highly positive attitudes to learning. Staff and pupils share highly respectful relationships. This creates an open and encouraging culture where everyone is equally valued."

We believe that teachers should be able to teach and that those that want to learn should never have their learning disrupted. We show zero tolerance to bullying.

Having said this, we also know that students behave best when they enjoy their learning. Students feel that their learning has purpose, and their achievements are recognised and celebrated by staff who believe in them. We will always strive to bring this positivity to each student at West Bromwich Collegiate Academy.

A great education is a partnership between staff, students and families. We know how important families are to students' success and we want to work with you to ensure that they achieve all they can.


This starts with open and regular communication with you. There is a main teacher for your child that you can talk to about your child's progress. We have a number of great apps that you can use to see how your child is performing.

The Academy is also a community space and many local groups utilise our facilities out of hours. Many of these are open to our students, such as Police Cadets and holiday workshops and camps.


## WELLBEING

Starting a secondary school can be a daunting prospect for students coming from primary school. At some schools these students can struggle as they have so many different teachers but no one to really focus on them and look after their welfare.

This is not the case at WBCA. Our pastoral support starts with the close ties that families and students make with their L4L teacher who is the first point of contact for any issues or concerns you may have.

In addition, the Academy employs a suite of mentors and councillors to support students who have challenges in their lives.
