Highlights from the term

Christmas Fair

Christmas has been in full swing, with over 500 people through the door for our Christmas Fair. There were, stalls, games, activities, copious amounts of food and singing from our choir. No Christmas Fair would be complete without Santa in his very own grotto. Evenings like this are where we are proud to be part of the community and it was great to see so many faces past and present visiting us.



Christmas Variety Showcase

Our Hippodrome supported Theatre School were in full swing earlier in the month for our Christmas Variety Showcase. If you missed it you missed, A Psychedelic Cha Cha, Phantom of the Opera, the Back Street Boys, Hairspray, Cinderella, Peter Pan, Aladdin and our very own Mrs Henderson as Mad Dog Mary with a starring role.

Holocaust Survivor Visitor

We were absolutely delighted to welcome Henry Schachter a Holocaust survivor who came to talk to our Year 9 students and Year 11 GCSE History students about his experience during the second world war. This was a rare experience for this kind of first-hand knowledge, fascinating the students.

Empathy Action – Dharavi Day

Our Year 8 students took part in an unforgettable immersive experience called The Poverty Trap, delivered by the charity Empathy Action. This powerful workshop transformed our sports hall into a simulated slum environment, challenging students to make tough decisions about food, shelter, and survival.

The day was designed to spark empathy and deepen understanding of global inequality—key themes in our India curriculum. Students described the experience as “insightful” and “thought-provoking,” helping them





empathise with the harsh realities of life in squatter settlements.

We are incredibly proud of how engaged and respectful our students were throughout. A huge thank you to Empathy Action for making this inspiring day possible.

A rich variety of other visitors and speakers have been into the Academy. This has included:

Medieval Speaker

Year 7 and Year 10 GCSE History students took part in a visit from a history re-enactor about the Medieval period and the Norman Conquest. They thoroughly enjoyed looking at and wearing the armour and re-creating the shield wall! They gained valuable insight and knowledge which will support them in their history studies.

Enfinium

Year 11 Geography students met with key employees of Enfinium Kelvin. They were taught about the waste to energy scheme and used VR headsets to experience the process of how waste is converted into our energy. They had valuable career insights and learned about potential apprentice schemes on offer.

Solar for Schools

We would like to thank Danielle from Solar for Schools for coming in and delivering a session to our Year 10 and 11 Geography students. Students were able to understand how solar panels work and future careers that will be associated with green energy.

Should Sandwell Valley Country Park be sold for housing?


657 votes | 400+ said NO – a clear message to protect green spaces!

In November, our 15 newly appointed Student Wellbeing Ambassadors spent the morning receiving specialist training from Mindful Life counsellors. The session focused on equipping ambassadors with the skills to support peers who may be struggling with their wellbeing.

As part of their ongoing commitment to promoting positive mental health, the ambassadors have developed a plan to raise the profile of wellbeing across the school community. This includes running a dedicated Wellbeing Drop-In Room every breaktime, providing a safe and supportive space for students to talk and seek help.

Car Park and Dropping off students
